

### **Visit to Bill and Ronnie's Water Garden**

The visit to Bill and Ronnie's water garden (see pictures below) is Friday, July 8 from 6–8:30 p.m. Take **Route 25A east** until you see the entrance to the Shoreham-Wading River High School on your right. Shortly after that, you will see **Randall Rd. on your left** (there are two new houses being built on the right-hand side of the road). **Make a left onto Randall Rd.** Stay on Randall Rd. until you can make your **first left turn onto Fawn Meadow Path**. Go up Fawn Meadow Path and then make the first right turn onto **Hunters Trail**. It is a cul-de-sac; go to the end of it and you will see a traffic circle and a green mailbox with the **number "9"** on it (if lost, call: 929-3827).

Please park from the mailbox on down the road and **not behind the traffic circle**; service trucks need to use it and your car will be in jeopardy. Also, please, **do not park in the driveway** (you will understand why when you see it)!

Go to the front door (the second door on your left) and ring the brown Chinese gong by the pond and someone will let you in. Drive safely, and we will see you on 7/8.

**Budget Update** (*Vicki McLane*)

The Executive Board has made some additions to the annual budget. We will be voting on most of these at a short meeting during our visit to Bill and Ronnie Schiavo's Garden. The additions to the budget are as follows.

1. FGCNY District II spring luncheon: \$10 donation to Suffolk County North raffle prize, \$115 for 3 officers' attendance (President, Vice-President, Treasurer).
2. FGCNY District II fall luncheon: \$10 donation to Suffolk County North raffle prize, \$115 for 2 officers' attendance (President, Secretary).
3. LI Gardener subscription for Board members and appointed positions (Ways and Means, Hospitality, Sunshine Fund, *etc.*): \$45.
4. New Post Office box key: \$5.50.
5. Garden Party subsidy: \$300.
6. FGCNY District II scholarship to SUNY Farmingdale horticultural student: \$100.

Regarding items 1, and 2: The President has traditionally had a budget to attend these luncheons. However, I feel, and the Board agrees, that it is very important to understand what benefits we derive from belonging to the FGCNY and to forge closer ties with the other Garden Clubs in Suffolk County. (I will write about this in the next newsletter).

Regarding item 3: It is important that the Club reward those who volunteer to make the events we all enjoy possible.

Regarding item 6: Last year we took in over \$600 for the scholarship fund and are spending only \$300 on the Agnes Allen Award. The \$100 would come from the surplus.

Items 1 and 4, of necessity, have already been spent.
